

Welcome to Yorke Peninsula

Located on Adelaide's doorstep, Yorke Peninsula offers breathtaking scenery, crowd-free beaches, picturesque townships, outdoor adventure and loads of barefoot fun.

Sometimes the best things in life are closer than you might imagine. This is certainly the case with Yorke Peninsula. Shaped like a leg and surrounded by the Spencer Gulf on one side and Gulf St Vincent on the other, the peninsula is just a short drive from Adelaide and yet offers a fantastic combination of Mediterranean climate, rich farmland, white sandy beaches, a spectacular national park and a fascinating cultural heritage.

If you love seafood, you can stroll through the shallows raking for Blue Swimmer crabs, dive for crayfish and scallops just offshore, or cast a line for King George whiting. If you prefer to leave the catching to the locals, there are seafood outlets and great eateries where you can feast on freshly caught seafood.

Yorke Peninsula boasts some of Australia's best surfing beaches and has two underwater maritime heritage trails for divers. The Walk the Yorke trail is a continuous 500 kilometre leisure trail following the coastline of Yorke Peninsula, while the magnificent Innes National Park, with its stunning beaches, rugged coast and wildlife, is a much-loved destination for campers, surfers, anglers, hikers and nature lovers.

Originally the home of the Nharangga people, the peninsula was settled by Europeans in the 1850s. The 19th century saw an explosion of agriculture and a copper mining boom that attracted thousands of Cornish miners to work the mines.

A host of museums proudly maintain this cultural legacy and provide an amazing insight into the intriguing history of these times.

Whether you are looking for a lazy beach shack holiday, luxury apartment, holiday house, caravan park, farmstay or camping – you'll find it all on Yorke Peninsula, South Australia's most exciting and accessible holiday destination.

Getting here & AROUN

Starting just 90 minutes by car from Adelaide, Yorke Peninsula offers a wide choice of self-guided tours to help you explore the region.

Getting to Yorke Peninsula By road

Whether you are bringing your own vehicle or hiring one, Yorke Peninsula is a great driving experience. Simply follow National Highway One from Adelaide. Your journey along the peninsula begins north of Port Wakefield. The driving is easy and best of all, there are no traffic lights. Towns and attractions are within close proximity to one another, making for a leisurely drive. Travel at your own pace and stop when you want to take in the sights. Fuel is available in most towns, as are snacks and travel essentials. Just remember most petrol stations close early, at around 5pm or 6pm.

By coach

Yorke Peninsula Coaches operate regular services from Adelaide Central Bus Station on Franklin Street to various towns throughout Yorke Peninsula. There is a separate inter-town bus route connecting towns in the southern part of the region, but in general there are limited bus services between major towns on the peninsula.

Getting around Yorke Peninsula

Self-drive tours

Yorke Peninsula has a colourful history and interesting landscape waiting to be discovered and a number of possible itineraries are listed on this page. The region is a key part of the Seafood Frontier self-drive touring route, which takes in Innes National Park, Ardrossan, Stansbury, Marion Bay, Moonta and Wallaroo. Adelaide–Samphire Coast–Port Wakefield–Port Clinton–Price–Ardrossan

On your way to Yorke Peninsula, drop in at these coastal townships to experience the Samphire Coast which extends from Port Gawler just north of Adelaide, up around Gulf St Vincent to Ardrossan. This coastal area is a haven for birdlife. Have your camera at the ready.

Kadina-Wallaroo-Moonta

Absorb the history of the Copper Coast and relax on a sparkling beach at Wallaroo, Port Hughes or Moonta Bay. Early mornings at Wallaroo offer the spectacular sight of prawn boats leaving the harbour (in season).

Maitland–Port Victoria–Minlaton

Meander through barley country and discover the historic townships of Maitland, Port Victoria (which was the last of the windjammer ports) and Minlaton.

Yorketown–Warooka–Corny Point– Marion Bay

Stock up on supplies at Yorketown and Warooka before heading to the famous Innes National Park. Marion Bay is the perfect base from which to experience this spectacular area and coastline.

By taxi

Yorke Peninsula has two taxi services that are based within the Copper Coast area and service Yorke Peninsula seven days a week.


Drive on left in Australia

Catch of THE DAY

The waters around Yorke Peninsula are a paradise for anglers and provide some of the best fishing and boating experiences in South Australia.

Wherever you go on Yorke Peninsula's coastlines – Gulf St Vincent, Spencer Gulf or the Bottom End – you'll find some of the best table fish and shellfish in the world; all of it can be caught from a boat, off the shore or from one of the many jetties.

Most coastal towns have good boat launching facilities. For recreational anglers, the key point to remember is to stick to the legal sizes, bag and boat limits where applicable. It's also important to find out when and where snapper fishing closures are in place. By obeying the rules you'll help protect South Australia's valuable fish stocks. For more information on recreational fishing regulations in South Australia, visit www.pir.sa.gov.au/fisheries

There are four marine parks located around Yorke Peninsula. You can still enjoy fishing within the marine parks, with restrictions applying to sanctuary zones. For more information and sanctuary zone locations, visit www.marineparks.sa.gov.au

Keep up-to-date on the latest fishing rules, regulations and closures by downloading the free South Australian Recreational Fishing Guide smart phone app (suitable for all devices) at www.pir.sa.gov.au/recfishingapp For more information, download the Yorke Peninsula Fishing Guide from www.yorkepeninsula.com.au. The guide has all the information you need to make the most of your fishing holiday, including maps, bait and tackle outlets, marine services, boat hire, boat ramps, jetties and, most importantly, what species can be caught where. You'll also find a range of fishing charters who are ready to take you on anything from a half-day trip to an overnight adventure.

Blue Swimmer crab

Crabs can be caught all year round but summer months are more productive, especially when raking for crabs. Legal size and bag limits apply.

Australian salmon

Found anywhere there is a headland, bluff or surf area. Salmon can be caught all year round using pilchards or lures for bait.

Southern Rock lobster

Rugged coastline areas on the southern shores of Yorke Peninsula are home to Southern Rock lobster. These tasty little morsels are allowed to be caught in the open season (from noon on 1 November to 6pm on 31 May).

Let's go SURFIN(

Whether you are a beginner or an experienced surfer, you'll enjoy tackling the excellent breaks to be found on the south-western part of Yorke Peninsula.

Yorke Peninsula hosts a number of major surfing and body boarding competitions and is home to the first dedicated national surfing reserve on Australia's southern coast, Daly Head.

Please be aware of the potentially dangerous nature of some surf breaks. Take care in remote areas and please seek advice from the locals.

Chinamans

Innes National Park

A hollow, very powerful left-hand reef break of excellent quality, complete with a hair-raising take-off and a sharp, shallow ledge – definitely for experienced riders only.

Heavy surf.

Pondalowie Bay

Innes National Park

A very good quality, combination beach and reef break.

Medium surf.

Richards

Innes National Park

About 250 metres north of the main break at Pondalowie, this is a good quality right-hand beach and reef combination that breaks up to 1.5 metres.

Medium surf.

West Cape

Innes National Park

A left (occasionally right-handed) beach break of up to two metres. Best on north or northwest winds and low to medium tide. Heavy surf.

Baby Lizards

North of Point Margaret in Formby Bay, Baby Lizards can be good but is generally only an average quality, short, right-hand reef break up to two metres. It's best on easterly winds with a medium to high tide.

Medium surf.

Daly Head

An average to good quality left and occasional right-hand reef break of up to four metres. Best on south-east to easterly winds and low to medium tide.

Heavy surf.

SURF RATING

Medium surf

Waves generally two metres or more. Breaking either on sandy bottom or reef.

Heavy surf

Waves are above two metres. Breaking on rock or reef and subject to strong undercurrents.

Rock Pool

Just south of Daly Head, this is a powerful right-hand reef break up to three metres and bigger; best on north-west winds on any tide. **Heavy surf.**

Salmon Hole

A good quality, right-hand, semi-point break, up to two metres, Salmon Hole is long, hollow and fast. It's best on north-westerly winds and low to medium tide. Located just south of Daly Head.

Medium surf.

Trespassers

Near Point Margaret, Trespassers can be reached by Corny Point Road. It's a good quality, right-hand, reef break, up to three metres; definitely for experienced riders only. Heavy surf.

Dive & SNORKEL



Want to get under the waves? Then you've come to the right place. Yorke Peninsula offers a range of great dive spots, from jetties to shipwrecks, for both snorkelling and scuba diving.

With a combination of unspoilt ocean waters and marine habitats, including sandy beaches, reefs and islands, there is a huge diversity and abundance of fish and crustacean species to discover.

Two underwater Maritime Heritage Trails provide excellent diving opportunities for beginners and the more experienced diver. The Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail includes a total of eight wreck sites, while the Investigator Strait Shipwreck Trail highlights 10 vessels wrecked in the region. The Zanoni shipwreck

Lying 10 nautical miles south-east of Ardrossan, the *Zanoni* is the most intact 19th century merchant sailing vessel in South Australian waters. People interested in diving on the wreck must obtain a permit from www.environment.sa.gov.au

Edithburgh jetty

Renowned for its spectacular diving and ease of access, the jetty is home to a variety of marine life, including Big-belly seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, Leafy Sea dragons and cuttlefish, plus a variety of fish and colourful corals.

Investigator Strait

The Investigator Strait Shipwreck Trail lies between Yorke Peninsula and Kangaroo Island and highlights 10 of the 26 shipwrecks dating from 1849 to 1982. These vessels range from the famous *Clan Ranald* (a huge 3596 tonne steel steamer that sank west of Troubridge Hill in 1909) to the *Welling*, a 10 tonne wooden fishing cutter. Please note that the waters of Investigator Strait can be treacherous (as seen by the number of ships that have come to rest here) so please take all safety precautions and advise someone of your plans.

Stenhouse Bay jetty

Difficult access makes this site available to experienced divers only. The dive has clear water with an abundance of marine life.

Point Gilbert at Port Moorowie

Fantastic shallow snorkelling, with great visibility. Expect to see a Port Jackson shark nursery and some huge Eagle rays.

Parsons Beach Reef

On a calm day this is the perfect spot for beginners to snorkel. The reef runs the length of Parsons Beach, with a variety of marine life to observe in the shallows. It can be reached by 4WD vehicle or you can park your car and walk 100 metres to the beach.

Wardang Island

The Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail has eight shipwrecks within 10 nautical miles of one another. Amazingly, no lives were lost in any of these shipwrecks. Clear shallow waters make it ideal for novice shipwreck divers. Mooring buoys are located at five of the wrecks.



Locally caught seafood, freshly baked bread, handmade chocolates and other artisan produce make Yorke Peninsula a tasty proposition.

With an abundance of snapper, garfish, King George whiting, scallops, oysters, Blue Swimmer crabs and Southern Rock lobster, Yorke Peninsula has always been popular with lovers of seafood. The region has widened its foodie offerings to include gelato, handmade chocolate, honey and local olive oil.

Known for growing some of the world's finest wheat and barley, the region also boasts a small wine industry. Barley Stacks Wines, near Maitland, is the first commercial winery on Yorke Peninsula, producing Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon and liqueur Chardonnay, while Emoyeni Wines at Ardrossan is a relative newcomer, planting vines in 2000.

Thanks to its Cornish heritage, Yorke Peninsula maintains a strong baking tradition. Fresh bread, cakes and other treats are widely available and no visit to this part of South Australia is complete without sampling an authentic Cornish pasty.

While many visitors will enjoy the excitement of catching their own fish, there are several fresh seafood outlets on the peninsula, including Gill Fisheries at Port Victoria. Locally grown produce, eggs and meat are also available, alongside some homemade gelato – perfect for preparing your holiday feast.

While the local pub remains the cornerstone of many smaller towns on the peninsula, visitors will also find a good range of contemporary eateries serving fresh seafood – oysters, Blue Swimmer crab, Southern Rock lobster and King George whiting are all popular – alongside locally sourced beef, lamb, chicken and other gourmet produce.

Some spots to check out include Inland Sea Restaurant, just west of Warooka, specialising in locally sourced seafood. Relax in their elegant restaurant or beer garden with tropical surrounds. Minlaton Chocolaterie is a haven for those with a sweet tooth, producing a range of handmade chocolates with fruits, nuts and liqueurs. Salt of the Earth Café is great for home cooked treats and the Marion Bay Tavern is well known for its range of beers and excellent wood-fire oven pizzas.

Most restaurants and cafés offer a good range of South Australian wines by the glass – a fantastic way to round off that long, lazy lunch overlooking the ocean.

Those who want to delve deeper into the local foodie scene can follow the Seafood Frontier,

a self-guided tour from Adelaide through Yorke Peninsula to Eyre Peninsula. The road trip includes Ardrossan, Stansbury, Warooka, Innes National Park, Marion Bay and Wallaroo. Visit www.roadtrips.southaustralia.com for more information on the Seafood Frontier road trip.

The exciting Walk the Yorke trail follows the coastline of Yorke Peninsula and is a 500 kilometre shared walking, cycling and leisure trail. The trail links up the existing coastal trails and showcases spectacular coastline, diverse coastal communities and environments unique to Yorke Peninsula.

Walk the Yorke offers everything from a casual stroll to half-day, full-day and multi-day walks. Highlights include wandering from Port Clinton to Price through samphire flats and mangroves, exploring the famous red cliffs between Tiddy Widdy Beach and Ardrossan, finding the sea-themed mosaic walk in Coobowie, Edithburgh and Sultana Point, visiting the bush garden at Port Moorowie and watching the fantastic birdlife and other wildlife in Innes National Park.

Walkers will also find several shorter walks throughout Yorke Peninsula:

Barkers Rocks Walking Trail

This five kilometre trail between Barkers Rocks and Port Rickaby takes about two hours each way and features a pristine coastal reserve with great coastal views.

Edithburgh Environmental Walk

This walk winds its way for four kilometres from Edithburgh to Sultana Point. It's an easy walk with a beach or cliff top option and wheelchair access. There's also a five kilometre walk that takes you right along the coast to Coobowie.

Innes National Park walking trails

The park has excellent walking trails ranging from short loops to half-day hikes and caters for people of all interests and abilities. The trails provide some of the best coastal views in the state and there are plenty of opportunities to see birds and other wildlife.

Minlaton Walking Trail

Starting at the Visitor Information Centre, this six kilometre walk heads to the H.J. Brian Cook Animal Reserve before meandering through the outskirts of town. The trail includes a pumping station, bridges and interpretive signs about the river red gums – Minlaton is the only area on the southern Yorke Peninsula where these trees grow naturally.

Moonta Mines walking trails

Discover the history of this copper mining region via three marked trails: Ryans Walk, Hancocks Walk and Hughes Walk. Visit the Moonta Tourist Office for more information.

Port Broughton Historic Walking Trail

Visit some of the historic landmarks and learn about Port Broughton's history. Collect a 'Walk Around Port Broughton' booklet from the Visitor Information Outlet.

Port Victoria Geology Trail

This trail runs south from the jetty to Rifle Butts Beach and highlights include volcanic action from nearly 2000 million years ago. Allow about two hours for this easy three kilometre walk. An excellent guidebook is available from the foreshore kiosk.

Port Vincent Walking Trail

This gently undulating trail runs through native scrub on Water Reserve on the northern boundary of Port Vincent. Entry is north of the Port Vincent marina.

Stansbury Coastal Trail

This six kilometre, three-stage walk stretches from the jetty, along the foreshore, past the caravan park and to the cemetery. Then choose between a cliff top or beach walk to Pitts Cutting.

Wallaroo, Kadina and Moonta town walking trails

The walking trails give visitors an insight into the history of these towns and their many old buildings. In each town the self-guided tours take about one hour and brochures are available from the Copper Coast Visitor Information Centre in Kadina.

Marine parks & NATIONAL PARKS

Inspiring ocean views, abundant wildlife and a rare window into the past, only three hours' drive from Adelaide.

Incredible coastal environments and nature experiences

Innes National Park is the perfect place to let your mind drift away as you gaze over the ocean, where on a clear day you can see Kangaroo Island shimmering in the distance. The park protects the largest area of native vegetation on Yorke Peninsula, so a visit is a great opportunity to reconnect with nature. Its stunning coastal environment is protected by Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park, which spans Investigator Strait to join with the north coast of Kangaroo Island.

It's essential to pay park entry online at www.parks.sa.gov.au or at an agent before entering the park.

Unique accommodation and mining history

Innes National Park is home to seven renovated heritage lodges at the Inneston Historic Township, which is the perfect base from which to explore the park. The cottages offer accommodation for two to 10 people, so you can retreat to a comfortable bed and hot shower if you fancy a change from camping. After being abandoned for decades, Inneston Heritage Village offers an insight into the living conditions of the 200 gypsum miners who used to live there. A stroll along the Inneston Historic Walk is the best way to explore the village and learn about this special part of South Australia's mining history. Book heritage accommodation online at www.parks.sa.gov.au

Shipwrecks, lighthouse views and great walking trails

If you enjoy combining history and long walks in nature you'll love the Investigator Strait Shipwreck Trail, which tells the story of the many shipwrecks that lie off the coast of Innes National Park. Or you could follow the West Cape Headland walk past a stainless steel lighthouse to the West Cape Lookout and its breathtaking 360 degree views of the Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park, including Pondalowie Bay, Wedge Island and Althorpe Islands Conservation Park. The West Cape visitor area provides beach access, sheltered picnic tables, toilets and parking.

Great photos of iconic native wildlife

Innes offers great opportunities to snap photos of iconic Australian animals. The park has many Western Grey kangaroos and emus and you might even see the small Tammar wallaby, which was reintroduced to Innes after becoming extinct on the South Australian mainland in the 1920s. Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park is home to pods of dolphins all year round, while schools of Southern Right whales cruise past from May to September. Honeyeaters, Malleefowl and White-bellied Sea eagles are among the park's 140 species of birdlife. Please remember that the park's reptiles are protected and love to lie on the park's roads, so drive carefully.

Camp among beautiful coastal Mallee

Innes has seven designated campgrounds, often a short sprint from the surf. Pondalowie Bay Campground or Pondie – has public toilets, gas barbecue facilities and up to 50 campsites, including areas for caravans, motor homes and trailers. To really get away from it all, try Shell Beach, Casuarina or Cable Bay campgrounds. Please note that campfires are not permitted at Pondie and are prohibited throughout Innes National Park during fire danger season.

Our HERITAGE

Yorke Peninsula has a rich cultural heritage, weaving together the Dreamtime stories of its Indigenous people and later European settlers.

Aboriginal Australians are one of the world's oldest living populations. In South Australia there are hundreds of different Aboriginal groups, each with their own dreaming stories, language, heritage and traditions. The Aboriginal people of Yorke Peninsula are the Nharangga people, also known as Adjahdura. They have a strong spiritual and physical connection to the land and sea. Dreaming stories tell how their country was shaped and how the land, sea, rivers, sky and stars were created. Point Pearce is the Aboriginal community on Yorke Peninsula. Cultural protocols exist to access Aboriginal land.

For an amazing insight into the Aboriginal people of this country, and of their rich cultural heritage, dreaming stories and traditions, walk in their footsteps with Aboriginal Cultural Tours South Australia. In 1859, copper was discovered near Kadina which created a mining boom that attracted skilled workers from many parts of Britain, including Cornwall. So many skilled Cornish miners worked the Moonta and Wallaroo mines that the area became known as 'Australia's Little Cornwall'. The mines closed in 1923. The Moonta Mines Museum provides a fascinating overview of the region's mining heritage.

The Farm Shed Museum, Kadina

In 1860, a successful wheat crop at Green Plains, near Kadina, saw the explosion of agriculture. Kadina's Farm Shed Museum & Tourism Centre as well as the Maitland Museum provide an insight into the lives of the region's pioneering families and the impact their farming practices had on modern Australian agriculture.

The ingenuity of early settlers is on display at the Ardrossan Museum, cataloguing the history of the Stump Jump Plough. In 1876, this remarkable invention ended the laborious, backbreaking work of clearing mallee stumps.

The rich limestone soils soon produced bumper crops and Yorke Peninsula became known as the 'Barley Capital of the World'. It's still one of the richest wheat and barley regions in the world and many of the biggest breweries in Australia, Europe and Asia use malted barley from this region.

Until the early 20th century, the only way to transport this cereal to Britain was by ship, and windjammers were a common sight along the coastline. The Wallaroo Heritage & Nautical Museum, Port Victoria's Maritime Museum and the Edithburgh Museum all provide visitors with a vivid insight into the fascinating history of these amazing times.

Enjoy the stories of pioneer aviator, Captain Harry Butler by visiting the National Trust Museum in Minlaton, home to his infamous monoplane - Red Devil - believed to be the only genuine one of its kind left in the world.



227 kilometres from Adelaide map reference E11

Located in the south-eastern corner of the region overlooking Troubridge Island, Edithburgh has always been one of Yorke Peninsula's landmark towns, made more so now by the Wattle Point Wind Farm located here.

The town has hotels, motels, a caravan park, coastal golf course and parklands laid out to the same design as those in Adelaide by Colonel William Light. The Bakehouse Arts and Crafts Incorporated offer a wide range of pottery, ceramics, art and local produce.

With the beach never far away, there isn't much need for swimming pools but Edithburgh has one. The tidal saltwater pool is a great hit in summer and has a shallow area for kids.

The coastal walks to Sultana Point and Coobowie come highly recommended.

Edithburgh is an excellent location for anglers with mullet, yellow fin, whiting and larger fish all popular catches. Fish from the jetty, boat or beach. Boat launching is easy from the harbour with twin boat ramps and floating pontoons. The jetty is well known for its spectacular diving and snorkelling. Here you can see a variety of marine life, from Leafy Sea dragons to Big-belly seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, cuttlefish and a variety of fish and corals.

Visit the museum and learn about the large salt industry that once dominated the town and discover the history of the *Clan Ranald* and *Marion* shipwrecks that lie just off the coast.

Kadina is the largest town on Yorke Peninsula – large enough to have suburbs called Jerusalem, Jericho, Matta Flat, Newtown, Kadina East and Wallaroo Mines. In its heyday in the late 19th century, Kadina had a population of 20,000. In 1859, copper was discovered near Kadina. This brought many skilled Cornish miners and their families to the region, who left a mark that can still be seen in this area today.

Over the years, Kadina has been the unofficial capital of Australia's Little Cornwall, the Copper Triangle and now the Copper Coast; each name a true testament to the region's mining past and cultural origins, celebrated biennially at Kernewek Lowender, the Copper Coast Cornish Festival in Moonta, Wallaroo and Kadina. The next festival is 15–21 May 2017. Eventually mining ceased and farming took over as the mainstay industry. To learn more about this part of Kadina's diverse history, visit The Farm Shed Museum and Tourism Centre.

Kadina's Royal Exchange Hotel was simply the Exchange Hotel until the Duke of Clarence stayed here in 1880. The Duke is considered a suspect in perhaps the most infamous murder case of all times. So did Jack the Ripper once spend the night in Kadina, surrounded by slumbering Cousin Jacks?

Kadina offers some good shopping and art enthusiasts will enjoy the Ascot Gallery and Picturesque Framing and Gallery.

Minlaton was settled in the 1870s by farmers who found the conditions ideal for growing wheat, barley and the grazing of sheep. Today it is known as the 'Barley Capital of the World', with extensive barley and wheat fields covering the surrounding countryside. While Minlaton is a service centre for the district, it also caters for visitors. There is a newly upgraded playground and picnic area, and the main street has a variety of shops. Be sure to call in to Harvest Corner and Yorke Peninsula Visitor Information Centre for local produce, quality crafts and visitor information and the Minlaton Chocolaterie, for over 40 flavours of handmade chocolates.

A picturesque walking trail includes Yorke Peninsula's only red gum stand, Aboriginal wells and a sheoak forest. Near the town's animal reserve is a memorial to Captain Harry Butler, who in 1919 flew his World War 1 Red Devil Bristol monoplane on the first special mail delivery across the sea to Minlaton. It's believed to be the only genuine one left in the world and has been restored to its original condition and can be seen on the edge of the town.

161 kilometres from Adelaide map reference D5

Moonta's origins in 1860 were very fortunate – a shepherd noticed traces of copper on a wombat burrow, which led to the establishment of the Moonta Mining Company that soon became one of the richest copper mines in Australia. The ensuing flood of skilled miners from Cornwall changed the state's cultural mix. Today, the Kernewek Lowender Copper Coast Cornish Festival is the world's largest Cornish festival held biennially in Moonta, Wallaroo and Kadina in odd numbered years. The next festival will be held 15–21 May 2017.

There are plenty of beautiful old buildings including the Moonta Mines Museum in the Moonta Mines Model School. Built around 1878, the museum is well worth a visit and on weekends a tourist train can take you around the heritage areas.

You can also enjoy a stroll along the main street where you'll find a variety of shops from antiques to giftware, bakeries, hotels, cafés and the Moonta Gallery of the Arts.



The Samphire Coast extends from Port Gawler, just north of Adelaide, along the eastern side of Gulf St Vincent to Port Wakefield, then around the top of the gulf to Ardrossan. This coastline is one of 10 priority sites under the World Wildlife Fund Australia Shorebird Conservation Project – and forms part of the International Bird Sanctuary. The Samphire Coast is host to over 60,000 migratory shorebirds each year. An area of spectacular natural beauty, it has long been a drawcard for birdwatchers, crabbers and recreational anglers, providing a unique insight into mangrove forests, samphire flats and intertidal seagrass meadows on sand and mud flats.



STANSBURY

206 kilometres from Adelaide map reference E10

Stansbury sits on the pristine sheltered waters of Oyster Bay and attracts swimmers, waterskiers, sailors and windsurfers. It is popular with anglers and provides easy access to deeper water. 289 kilometres from Adelaide map reference A12

The southern-most settlement on Yorke Peninsula, Stenhouse Bay is the entry point to Innes National Park. Although it ceased being a town in the 1970s, its Heritage-listed jetty and old mining implements are a reminder that the district was once Australia's primary source of gypsum for plaster and cement. It is highly likely that almost every older house in southern suburban Australia has Inneston gypsum in it, shipped from Stenhouse Bay.

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THOMPSON BEACH

70 kilometres from Adelaide map reference G8

Thompson Beach is part of the Samphire Coast with good walking trails at both ends of the town. Thompson Beach is a popular spot for catching Blue Swimmer crabs, so be sure to pack your crab rake and tub.



WALLAROO

156 kilometres from Adelaide map reference D5

A deep-sea port and home to the Spencer Gulf prawn fleet, it's a popular holiday town, complete with a multi-million dollar marina development. The old waterfront still echoes the era when the triangle mined, smelted and delivered copper and other metals to the world. Visit the Wallaroo Heritage & Nautical Museum to relive this bustling time in Wallaroo's history. 232 kilometres from Adelaide map reference C10

Warooka is a service centre for the surrounding area and a great stop off to or from Innes National Park. It looks south to the Bottom End and north along the holiday coast from Hardwicke Bay around to Point Turton where you'll find white sandy beaches perfect for swimming and windsurfing. There are buildings dating from the late 1800s and the Warooka Museum, formerly the police station, houses a comprehensive exhibition of items originating from the surrounding area and is open Fridays 10am–3pm or by appointment.



WOOL BAY

215 kilometres from Adelaide map reference E10

Named Wool Bay because it had a cutting in the cliff wide enough to roll a bale of wool down to the beach, this seaside town once served as a port for the district's farms and pastoral runs. These days Wool Bay is a quiet getaway, perched over the gulf, with Stansbury and Edithburgh on either side. Enjoy the relaxed and peaceful atmosphere of this small town or try your luck at fishing or squidding from the jetty. On the cliff top you can see the remains of the lime kilns that were once common on this part of the peninsula.


